Dear Friends,

Again it is time to send greetings through these pages and to acquaint you with breeders for whom we introduce. This year we are pleased to add two facets to the introductory pages which have hitherto been missing. For Mrs. W. W. (Grace) Carlson of Omaha we are introducing two beautiful Siberian iris—an advance in dark blues, Joretta, which was given an Exhibition Certificate, and a very wide white which several discriminating judges have urged her to introduce, named Snow Flare. Grace is interested, as well, in Dwarf, Median and Table bearded irises and we have several on trial and hope next year to offer some of these. She laments the fact that a hybridizing program was not started earlier in her youth, although twenty-nine years have passed in pursuit of these lovely flowers. Grace is also interested in and working to improve *hemerocallis*. Undoubtedly she is like most of us—loves anything that grows (except weeds) and enjoys, as well, that thrill of achievement when advances appear among the seedlings. We were happy when the Carlsons dropped by a year ago in March while touring in Utah. Not always do we actually know some for whom we catalog—except through correspondence.

We introduce the first *Hemerocallis* (daylilies) this year and although we have grown a fine collection (and hybridized some) it has been our intent to add only new ones that are distinct. There are so many new "hems" introduced each year (even more than irises) and it is impossible to keep up with them yet not every one is actually worthy for introduction for each should be distinct or an advance in its color class. I have several of my own seedlings which I am testing and next year I hope to name and bring out one or two diploids, an eyed variety and a ruffled bi-color are two that please me. My friend Mrs. Craven B. (Ethel) Helms of Monroe, N. C. sent her lovely golden hem for trial and the moment it bloomed I knew she had a winner. She has named this Gary Bee, for her son, and wanted the initial "B" but it was not approved. This is a marvelous flower and a great advance on either parent. Those who saw it in the home garden were enthusiastic in its praise and we had many requests for remets prior to its formal introduction. A plant was sent to the Stephen Foster garden for this year's *Hemerocallis* convention and to several areas from California to Catherine and Kenneth Smith's garden in New York.

Last year we introduced Flora McGee's TRISHA and its sister (brother) SIR GORDON is listed this year and certainly worthy of any words of praise I might lavish upon it. In the same color range as Marie Phillips, but coming in the earliest tall bearded season so its large, clean, classically formed flowers are a heart-warming, welcome sight. We congratulate Mrs. McGee on this splendid achievement and feel certain Sir Gordon will make friends for both of them for many years to come.

Beebe and Maynard Knopf of Potter Valley, Calif. are producing some marvelous seedlings and we are happy to be privileged to co-introduce their four new ones—each of which is distinct. The Aril-bred LORASON looks very like a Capitola derivative, but is not, of course, and although it has eluded being induced to set pods perhaps with persistence it may yet become a parent and we feel it will produce some wonderful offspring. Surely there are some very fertile Onco derivatives that will be compatible with this lovely hybrid. Merry Lynn or its child Marie Phillips might be two that will work for both are very fertile and there is a slight amount of Onco blood in these. Naturally the two fine things out of Queen's Lace, AMETHYST FLOUNCE and JABOT make us very proud. They are both lovely and distinct and carry great factors for further breeding. CRAFTSMAN is an improved Golden Garland and has so many fine qualities should be popular for a long time. We would like to see this crossed with Idaho Gold, Bright Forecast, Rainbow Gold, Astronaut, Soaring Kite, Mayberry's new Gold Lightning and Corabande should all yield beautiful things as could Country Cream, Flaring Ivory, Gray Lace, Christmas Angel, Patrician's Sweetheart and Glittering Amber.

While at the Loomis' garden in Colorado Springs last year, during the 1963 A.I.S. convention, we saw Dr. F. J. Knocke's novelty, BLUE TULIP. This will be a delight to flower arrangers and will be useful, as well, to those hybridizers who may be working for other forms in T. B. irises. This carries stigmas, but no pollen so will have to be used as a pod parent. A goodly stock permits a low introductory price. Its pedigree being what it is could make it useful, as well, for breeding whites, blues and other colors, including blue *amoenas* if used with them, and some unusual colors could result, producing, perhaps every other petal of white or some "Emma Cook-type" flowers. The plicata pattern may be bred into the line and should only take two generations to accomplish.

My friend and neighbor, George Mayberry, continues to produce a fine array of lovely seedlings. It pleases me to be able to offer GOLD LIGHTNING and LACED CHARM two excellent flowers with very good growing qualities and both stemming from long lines of our own things gives us a special pride in these. GOLD LIGHTNING has three and four buds to the socket which we think in an excellent quality and we hope this will be passed on to its progeny. This season will find a goodly number of its offspring blooming for the first time. Laced Charm was selected after a hard frost and could not be judged, but two years of normal bloom has lifted its rating each successive season. Lovely in itself I feel it is destined to be a wonderful parent as well. These two new ones carry the right genes. George and I left Utah at the peak of our blooming season to attend the A.I.S. Convention at Denver last year and while we were away rain and cool weather held the bloom in "cold stor-

age" and I shall never forget the sight which we beheld at 10 p.m. (by artificial light) when we invited Carl Quaddos of Sacramento, Calif. to join us in a "mad viewing" of George's seedlings. I'm sure the neighbors thought we had all lost our reason since the ground was soaked and with each step our weight increased and our walking became more labored, but it seemed not to deter us at all. How beautiful were those wide leather-like whites from Swan Ballet, and some lovely oranges, pastels, the laced and crimped creams and yellows. The next morning found us looking again. There were some beautiful rich blends from Formal Affair x Martel—very large and wide with lots of substance. George's 61-17-1 was a really stunning laced orange from Jan Elizabeth x Orange Frills) X (Orange Parade) which was registered at the close of the season as ORANGE VISTA—certainly a beauty and one even George had to admit was good. This year's seedlings hold promise of greater things, and I am sure to spend as much time among his seedlings as I do my own.

There is a "gal" named Loleta K. Powell in Princeton, N. S. rich in many talents and certainly an indefatigable hybridizer of both iris and hemerocallis. I have been privileged to trial many of her choice seedlings over a period of several years and was impressed with the quality of her superb TAR HEEL—an excellent "black" on the blue-side of purple. CAROLINA PEACH, looking very like a "cousin" to Court Ballet, has so much quality I am sure its heavy stalks, that tend to hang out from the center of the clump, will be a minor fault. It should be widely used for breeding. That Midwest Gem blood is sure to do great things for future generations. This one will breed many colors from pinks to whites, blends, yellows and lovely oranges and peach-colored flowers, with possibly an array of lavenders with tangerine beards.

Santa Monica, California has given us a young man seriously engaged in iris hybridizing as an avocation and we have been testing several of his seedlings. The one we offer this year by this young Phil Edinger has been named for his grandmother, LALITHA MALLETT, and it is certainly as fine a blue and white plicata as we have seen and with this superb pedigree is sure to be an excellent parent. If this and Latest Love are crossed surely any number of beautiful plicatas will result and many of these will be prone to bloom off-season in the mild climates, for both bloom many times during the year in their home state. We expect Phil to become one of our leading established hybridizers now that his military service and education are about to be completed.

Last year we offered Hubert Fisher's huge white iris Truth and this year we are happy to introduce a seedling of this fine variety—a beautiful white which has been named MEADOW SNOW. Hubert has promised to devote more time to his iris hybridizing, for his energies have been concentrated in the hemerocallis field for many years. Meadow Snow is in several gardens

on tour for the 1964 Convention, so it is hoped iris fanciers may see it. The pedigree of this beauty is such that it can produce marvelous quality in blues and whites and surely will be useful, also, to the new blue amoena lines.

Donald J. Boen of Walla Walla, Wash. sent his novelty PAINTED DOLL to Wilma Vallette who in turn sent it to me to guest. When this bloomed in the very late season I was taken with its similarity to that very old table iris Peacock's Eye, yet here was a standard T.B. and one to help close the season. Donald tells me he has produced a very good red amoena from its use as pod parent. Crossed with Melodrama or some of its seedlings (such as Gypsy Lullaby) is sure to give some unusual things. I am co-introducing this with Wilma Vallette.

Melvina Suiter has been one of my favorite people for so long that I suppose we must have started corresponding while she was busily engaged in rearing her family some twenty years ago. "Mel" as she is affectionately known, has had much success in hybridizing and perhaps Orange Frills, Tomeco, Apricat Lustre and Sky Hostess are among her better known named things. We are pleased to be able to offer her late blooming SPRING BOUQUET and the early medium blue KRISTINA this year—each marked with quality.

Good reports had reached us about Fisher Harris' wonderful yellow iris, so in the summer of 1962 I asked him to let me grow this since it isn't always possible for me to get to all the gardens in our area at the right time to see everything at peak bloom. When WESTERN SUN bloomed last year I knew at once this was worthy of a name. MELBA HAMBLEN also bloomed and pronounced it magnificent. It is a yellow on the "Mustard yellow" side with a decided metallic cast and wonderful "Dominion" round and flaring falls which it inherits from its marvelous progenitor, Tobacco Road. WESTERN SUN is going to become an important breeder for yellows and must surely be considered, also, as a likely breeder for improved browns and coppers, as well as blends, and possibly reds, although with its wonderful shape and substance some wide crosses with it will be most useful. While its two parents are "California-bred" it appears to be a remarkably fine grower—completely hardy.

We have known the Hardens (Clarence and Delphine) for many years, and they came by one year when vacationing while Jan Elizabeth was a baby, so that must have been eight or nine years ago. Delphine has been dabbling in hybridizing for a long time. She has never named any of her seedlings although I am sure she has had several fanciers would enjoy. Her BUTTERFLOWER started blooming here with the Lilliputs and is such a clean yellow and lovely in the clump that I was pleased when she consented to let me introduce this. Because of its pedigree it could breed some delightful borders in plicatas, pinks, apricots and possibly amoenas. Delphine and Clarence live on a beautiful farm in Protection, Kansas and are cattle breeders.

Perhaps their greatest pride is in their grandchildren, and rightly so, but they are a couple, also, who enjoy living and playing and traveling together.

And from "DAWN UNDER" another good friend of long standing has an aril-bred which I am releasing named FIJIAN SEAS. It carries plicata genes and is so very smoothly finished we feel it has a wonderful potential as a breeder and is introduced for that purpose. There is such vigor and fast growing qualities handed down by these I. hoogiana derivatives that they should prove of great worth to breeders. This iris also carries that wonderful Snow Flurry blood as well as the Dykes Medal winner San Francisco in its pedigree. Some lovely wisterias as well as whites, lavenders and pale blues can be bred from this iris. Of course very wide and flaring things should be employed. Marie Phillips, Lilac Festival and Merry Lynn are recommended mates.

Ethel and George Johnson of Hayward, California were growing Chet Nave's NOMO when I visited with them. I asked to grow this since it had a most unusual pedigree (Snow Flurry x I. nigricans) and was the first nigricans hybrid I had seen. After blooming it two years I asked Chet if I might list it for breeders who would undoubtedly like to see if it carries good genes for breeding purposes since it does set seed very readily. Chet is hybridizing plants and this year has another flower of his making being offered to the gardening public (a strain of Calla Begonia seed), but we hope he will return to the iris for his talents there could be most helpful. Chet is a neighbor of the Johnsons' already mentioned and to Frank Hutchings, Larry Gaulter and Walt Luhn as well as other Bay Area growers.

And for myself I am listing a good red of sound parentage, a different pink by-product which Charles Salzer of Bakersfield saved and admired as he grew and increased the stock for me and is named NORMA AVERETT. A reciprocal cross to Martel gave only three seedlings, a different red and a very rich blend with an unusual metallic finish which I have named WILD PEACOCK. This is a border plant that blooms in the very late season. And I have named a velvety yellow from Happy Thought x Pink Fulfillment, VELVET GOLD, which blooms with other pumila derivatives in the very early season, a flower of good width and very smoothly finished. RED STEP is just that in Spuria breeding—coming as it does from Washington x Nies lines—a lone seedling from this unusual and difficult cross. Mr. Ferguson of Escondido, Calif. has a red seedling from it which shows its ability as a parent. Being shorter than the usual "leggy" spuria it should be useful here, also, for bringing down the height. It is hoped through this little fellow some real color breaks will result—only time will tell, but I feel RED STEP has an excellent potential to the hybridizer. It is fertile both ways.

That completes the list of hybridizers whose irises and daylilies we are introducing this year. We feel it is a stunning group of exciting new garden subjects.

Because of rising costs of labor, postage, etc. I had to make a decision to discontinue many of the older and standard irises and daylilies. We hope to give better and more limited space to newer and improved plants.

Our Catalog is mailed to all current customers, or to those who send 50c and request it. The amount is deductible from your first order. Some old issues are still available at 50c each but the supply of some may be exhausted soon. We have '56, '58, '59, '61, '62, and '63 issues to release.

AMETHYST FLOUNCE M. Knopf '64) ML 36 in. (Jade Queen x Mission Trails) X (Queen's Lace) Amethyst violet self with matching beard. Conic standards, semi-flaring falls; excellent substance and branching. Exhibition Certificate '62 #61-16E. **\$30.00**

BLUE TULIP (Dr. F. J. Knocke '64) M 38 in. (Cliffs of Dover x Harbor Blue) Here is an unusual novelty which many saw in Dr. Loomis' garden during the 1963 convention. A blue self with greenish midribs—tulip-shaped has no beard or anthers. An arrangers' delight. Plentiful stock. #K 5. **\$5.00**

CAROLINA PEACH (L. Powell '64) ML 34 in. (Midwest Gem x Ballerina) Delicate-looking pastel-pink crimped and laced, has very wide laced styles. Falls flare horizontally and the standards are conic. The heavy stalks have a tendency to hang out from the clump, its only fault. Should be a tremendous parent for lace and many colors. # 58-8 **\$20.00**

CRAFTSMAN (M. Knopf '64) ML 40 in. (Golden Garland x Mission Trails) Striking and commanding is this much-improved Golden Garland-type flower. The large ruffled standards are deep yellow, falls cream with deep yellow $\frac{3}{4}$ inch border and heavier flush of orange-yellow at hafts. The beard is wide and a pronounced deep orange. The heavy strong stalks are beautifully branched. #62-12. **\$30.00**

FIRE RUBY (Muhlestein '64) ML 36 in. (Defiance x Bang) Afghan Red and Harvard Crimson (Maerz & Paul) the falls being richer and more pure red. Vigorous and very prolific #82. **\$15.00**

GOLD LIGHTNING (G. Mayberry '64) M-VL 38 in. ((49-30, sib. to Utah Cream x Spring Sunshine) x (Party Dress x Pink Formal) x Party Dress) X (Marilyn C) Heavily substantiated large rich yellow with lighter area in falls, deeper brushings of golden yellow at hafts, and there is an infusion of apricot elusively scattered through the flower. The long, heavy beard is intense reddish tangerine. Heavy stalks have three branches with three buds in the sockets and four buds in the Terminal. Fertile both ways. Every flower will set a pod if pollinated. I have seen four pods on the top, or terminal. H.C. '63. #58-7-1 **\$25.00**

JABOT (M. Knopf '64) ML 36 in. (Blossom Valley x Sib. to Mission Trails) X (Queen's Lace) Very wide ruffled, rippled and fluted lemon-yellow self including beard. Standards are heavy, stiff and slightly open, falls wide and very flaring. Superb substance coupled with wonderful rippling, fluting, and outstanding branching, give this cool and refreshing flower an air of beauty and distinction without counterpart. HC '61 #61-84 E. **\$30.00**

KRISTINA (M. Suiter '64) EM 31 in. (Sun Lakes x Silver Tower) Lovely wide medium blue that is rich and gives a very blue effect in the garden. The beard is blue-tipped. This ruffled beauty is a line-bred product of Purissima breeding and is sure to make a name for itself as a parent for blues as well as whites and possibly blue amoenas, when crossed to them. **\$20.00**

LACED CHARM (G. Mayberry '64) ML 40 in. (Mary Randall x Jan Elizabeth) Bred from two shorter parents this delicate pastel beauty stands high in the garden on heavy stalks. The ground color is ivory flushed delicate seashell to apricot or flamingo pink, very delicate in appearance but the color holds to the last. The petals are nicely laced and the beard is pinkish-tangerine. Standards domed and the falls wide, round and flaring. Most charming and personable. Its breeder and I have been employing it in quest of lacing in lavenders, whites and pinks with red or tangerine beards. Was, as well, crossed with Norma Averett. Fertile both ways #58-69-. **\$25.00**

LALITHA MALLETTE (Phil Edinger '64) ML 38 in. (Aldura x New Hope) We may reproduce a picture of this gorgeous white plicata with its violet blue markings on both standards and falls which are precise and delicate and there are no markings or lines in the center of the falls which give it a very clean appearance. It is flared, ruffled and wide of parts, the standards are conic. Usually has three-way branching, but will, under ideal conditions of growth, grow to 50 inches in height and have 4 branches and up to 22 buds. In California where it was bred it will bloom several times during the year, but has not done so in Utah, yet grows perfectly healthy. Received an Exhibition Certificate in 1962. #34-59 A. **\$25.00**

MEADOW SNOW (H. Fischer '64) M-VL 36 in. (Pierre Menard x Danube Wave) X (Truth) White, white self including beard with wide flaring falls, cupped (domed) and rounded—a classically formed beautiful flower. This will produce magnificent whites and blues. Helps to close the iris season and carries up to eleven buds per stalk. #3928 **\$25.00**

PAINTED DOLL (D. J. Boen '64) M-VL 36 in. (Extravaganza) X (53-11: Gypsy x Great Lakes) Do you know the table iris Peacock's Eye? Here is a vastly improved version of this unusual and striking flower—a true novelty. The standards are blue-white, flushed pale yellow at base. Upper part of falls are dark red-purple, lower part bright lavender, hafts brown with a few white reticulations, beard orange-yellow. Standards domed, falls medium-wide and semi-flaring. Has two or three branches with from eight to twelve buds. Throwing some red amoenas. Has pollen only occasionally and not easy to pod. #55-36. **\$15.00**

SPRING BOUQUET (M. Suiter '64) MVL 37 in. (Lady April x Fairday) Another to help close the season. One of the finest yellow amoenas I have grown. Large, full, heavily subtended flowers. Standards are white, the falls and styles are yellow. A classic pedigree for this color, and breeding superb seedlings with excellent branching. **\$20.00**

TAR HEEL (L. Powell '64) ML 36 in. (Top Hat x Black Taffeta) Actually a bi-color in the very dark black-purple on the blue side. Standards lighter than the velvety rich falls which are very wide and semi-flaring and distinctly ruffled. Heaviest substance. Fair branching. Was outstanding the past two years in our gardens and everyone who saw it wanted to own it. Holds up well in the heat of the late season. #L-4-74-F **\$25.00**

WESTERN SUN (F. Harris '64) M-VL 32 in. (Summer Sun X Glittering Gold) Although we seem to have many fine yellow irises, actually quality in this color class has lagged. Here is a real advance in yellows. A deep and rich mustard-yellow color that appears to have a metallic to almost velvety finish. Parts are very wide and the falls are perfectly round and flared horizontally—due to the heavy breeding (from each parent) from that wonderful iris Tobacco Road. Vigorous and hardy it will perform much better than either of its parents in almost any climate. A real masterpiece. H. C. Award 1963. **\$25.00**

BUTTERFLOWER (Delphine Harden '64) BB. E. 20 in. (plicata sdlg: Jake x Wabash) X Party Dress) Actually starts blooming with the "lil-liputs" and when you see this flower with its rich golden yellow color (Between crome-yellow and lemon-yellow) and the deeper, long orang-yellow beard you will suspect it has Party Dress as a parent. It could throw plicatas, amoenas, pinks, apricots and oranges. Pods rather easily with only a few seeds. **\$10.00**

NORMA AVERETT (Muhlestein '64) BB M-Late 28 in. (Native Dancer x June's Sister) Ivory to white ground flushed apricot pink. Falls lined amber at hafts, standards flushed coral with gold edge, falls edged coral-pink with a minute gold edge and a coral-red beard. I have seen nothing quite like it. The standards open (cup) and the falls flare—it has a distinct and unusual personality. H.C. '63. #92. **\$25.00**

WILD PEACOCK (Muhlestein '64) M-VL 24 in. (Jungle Bird x Bang) The reciprocal cross to Martel. Standards rosy-wine with tan infusion. Falls deeper wine with wide, strong flush of bright violet; hafts brushed deep brown almost one full inch. The flower is about five inches over all. Falls flare and ruffle. The entire flower glistens like the finish of a Peacock's feathers. H.C. '63. #166. **\$25.00**

VELVET GOLD (Muhlestein '64) IB 16 in. (Happy Thought x Pink Fulfillment) Cadmium yellow to deeper gold self, falls velvety. A rich yellow due to the velvety falls and thickness of the over-all petal structure. Great breeding potential. **\$15.00**

ARIL-BREDS

FIJIAN SEAS* (R. D. Spinkston '64) EM 40 in. (Cascadian x Hoogan) Porcelain-finished pale lavendre-blue-white self with light yellow beard. Distinctly showing its regelia breeding in the somewhat narrowed falls. Easy pod parent. Carries plicata factors. **\$5.00**

LAHARA* (E. Sundt '64) EM 30 in. (Imam Ahmad x Iman Salah) Bred from two good C. G. White irises this fine "yellow amoena" has glistening white standards and wide, round, flaring chrome-yellow falls with a pronounced signal patch. Fertile both ways. Undoubtedly 44 chromosomes #59-207A **\$25.00**

LORASON* (M. Knopf '64) EM 34 in. (Blossom Valley x I. Ioretti) Grayed blue self with blue tipped beard, slight signal patch at beard. Round, flaring falls. Looking for all the world like a Capitola seedling. No pollen and difficult to pod, but a good potential breeder if it can be induced to set seed. #13A11. **\$15.00**

NOMO* (C. F. Nove '64) EM 36 in. (Snow Flurry x I. nigricans) Blue-white self with light yellow beard. Shows only slightly its onocycclus breeding. No pollen but will pod rather easily. May be the first nigricans hybrid to be named, and introduced for this reason, and for breeding purposes. **\$10.00**

SIR GORDON* (Flora McGee '64) EM 34 in. (Jane Phillips x Capitola) Lavender-blue or Wisteria self with bluish beard. Domed standards, wide, round, perfect horizontally flared, slightly ruffled falls. A classic beauty and sheer perfection. Pods rather easily. Branching only modest, as with many Capitola derivatives yet it is stunning. A large flower. Sister seedling to Trisha. **\$25.00**

SPURIA IRIS

RED STEP (Muhlestein '64) M 30 in. (Monteagle x Bronze Butterfly) Standards appear quite red are reddish-brown (Light Mahogany) while the falls are darker than the standards. A smallish flower on short stalks. I feel this is a real break for breeders. Fertile both ways. #61-4 **\$20.00**

SIBERIANS

JORETTA (Grace Carlson '64) M 40 in. (Parentage unknown) Dark blue self, wide segments, falls very flaring and ruffled. A beautiful addition to this section, and surely to the blues. Received Exhibition Certificate 1959. #S57-2. **\$15.00**



ARIL-BRED IRISES

This section contains plants that have blood of the *Oncocyclus* or *Regelia* species in their background. The species are identified with an aril-like collar on the seed, however, not all hybrids, or second generation seedlings have this characteristic even though we place them in this category. Most of these show many of the characteristics of the species (arils) from which they descend. These are mostly all good garden subjects, easy growers. Only the pure arils (*Oncocyclus* or hybrids of these and *Regelias*) defoliate during the summer months. The C. G. White "hybrids" of more recent origin (having 44 chromosomes) are highly fertile both ways and proving of great interest and worth to hybridizers.

ABDALLAH KHAN (White '61) E. 36 in. Large yellow with domed standards and wide falls of a deeper canary yellow occasionally flecked with purple. HC '60. **\$6.00**

SPURIA IRIS

Spurias belong to the beardless species. Their hard, strong, rhizomes are ideal for halting banks. They bloom after the tall bearded season has closed. Their orchid-like flowers are splendid for corsages or for bouquet work and arrangements. Here is an open field for hybridizers who desire to work with this species. Their disease resistance make them the easiest iris to cultivate.

If spurias become affected with disease (or rot, which rarely occurs) Carco X (a coal-tar product

quite similar to creosote or stock dip) used according to directions sprayed over the leaves and rhizomes will clear up the trouble, or in stubborn cases it might be wise to lift, wash and dip all rhizomes in the solution. It is good to wash all new (incoming) rhizomes in this solution before they are planted to insure health. (Creolin, Creosote, or Lysol solutions may be used in place of Carco X if it is not available.)

HEMEROCALLIS (Daylilies)

Hems, as they are called, are fast becoming one of the leading perennials in America. Perhaps their great popularity is due to their ease of growth and the fact that hybridizers have made such masterful advances in the last two decades. Daylilies bloom in the late spring and all through the summer and many of the rebloomers continue until frost. The fact that they bloom during the heat of summer (before the annuals have started with their showing) makes them welcome additions to the summer garden. They are lovely planted in the borders interspersed with other plants. The "fountain-like" foliage is always attractive even when they are not in bloom.

If you have not tried some of the newer Kinds treat yourself to some and they will capture your heartstrings. If you have a natural "yen" for hybridizing you will enjoy working with these for they are easy to cross, the seeds germinate well, and they transplant easily and grow quickly. The seeds may be held until spring for planting or may be planted in the fall—either way germination is excellent and if transplanted early and given water and care will bloom within a year or two.

There are few diseases that plague daylilies. We think you will find them wonderful garden subjects as well as delightful for cutting and for flower arrangements.
