Greetings,

2015 is a special milestone for us - our 90th year. Hard work seems to make time pass quickly. Permit us a brief look backwards. The year was 1925. St. Paul, Minnesota. A 45 year old German immigrant, F.X. Schreiner, turned his hobby into a business publishing a list of bearded Iris for sale. Upon his untimely death 6 years later, F.X.'s son, Robert, assumed the reins. Eventually his siblings, Connie and Bernard (Gus) joined him. For approximately half a century, these 3 devoted their efforts to developing an outstanding breeding program, resulting in fine garden Irises, and also for establishing a standard for large, healthy rhizomes.

Change is a constant in life. In 1946 Schreiner's Gardens moved to Salem, in Oregon's fertile Willamette Valley. The 1970s saw our acreage, and number of available varieties, expand in response to a burgeoning wholesale demand for Iris. A third changing of the guard occurred in the 1980s, as Bob, Connie and Gus were succeeded by the current generation, of whom two, Dave Schreiner and Tom Abrego retired four years ago. 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

MAKIN' GOOD TIME (Schreiner 2015) L. 40" \$55.00

Here is a bicolor with few in its class, and even fewer with the finely chiseled form and sublime coloration of Makin' Good Time. Pale primrose yellow standards are perfectly shaped. Grape purple falls are washed with inviting violet tones, and outlined with a catchy white border. Distinctive white veining flanks a light beard. With 40" stalks and 3 branches, this late-blooming mover makes a beautiful garden Iris. Check out our photo at left and on the cover. Seedling #YY422-B

CHEYENNE SKY (Schreiner 2008) L. 38"

\$12.50

A sun-ripened peachy apricot hue paints the standards of this pink bitone. An engaging shrimp-pink shade overlays the same peachy apricot tint in the falls. Our picture **below** accurately shows the further embellishment of tangerine beards surrounded by a highlight of yellow. This prolific bloomer bursts into glory with 10 buds per stalk.

DREAM TICKET (Lauer 2006) ML. 36"

Dream Ticket is a pink lavender bicolor, cool and morning fresh, suggesting serenity and grace. See our photo **below**. The standards are well-formed, and a pleasing, soft pink. The center of the wide falls is white with a breath of lavender, which becomes more predominant on the outer half inch. Gentle ruffles add to the appeal. Definitely a real advance in the lavender pink bitone class. Pronounced sweet fragrance. HM '08.











PETTICOAT SHUFFLE (Schreiner 2010) M. 34"

\$15.00

Note in our picture **at left** the pencil thin ½" rim of violet-purple on the edges of the falls. Such delicate etching harmonizes perfectly with the lavender stitching of its standards. Double-socketed buds produce an ample 8 blossoms per stalk. HM '14.

DIABOLIQUE (Schreiner 1997) ML. 38"

\$7.50

Diabolique's exquisitely ruffled and flared flower form is apparent in our photo **below** of a stem in bloom. Its intense garnet-purple color challenges us to get noticed. Tall ramrod-thick stems display 8-9 bouncy flowers each. HM '99. AM '01. WM '03.

FLAME AMBER (Keppel 2009) EML. 38"

\$18.00

A great blend, the real deal, in an under-represented class, and also one which complements so many other colors found in the garden. The standards are rose with orange amber undertones, and the falls are the reverse. Vermilion beards add to the appeal of this beautifully colored, and perfectly formed gem. See our photo on **page 11**. Large blossoms and multiple buds define this as a vigorous grower. HM '11.

MAGIC HAPPENS (Ghio 2006) EM. 35"

\$22.00

In the world of Iris, an entirely new color simply does not materialize in a single day. Hybridizing progress is incremental. Aptly named *Magic Happens* is an example of a somewhat new color motif. Thirteen years ago, the hybridizer introduced *Vapor*, a rosy striped amoena. Now we have a singular purple striped amoena. Notice in our photo on **page 11** how the prominent orange beards, along with the veined, warm hafts, and gold touches on the white standards, make magic. HM '08

MYTHOLOGY (Johnson 2003) ML. 34"

\$16.00

A supremely beautiful color. Mythology sets itself apart - rare is the blue in the grayed blue-violet class. Notable also, it's a reverse amoena. The falls are paler than the standards. Outstretched falls, and very dark beards and hafts, and a slight spicy fragrance add to the mystique of this storyteller. Pictured on page 11. HM '06. AM '08.

RED SKIES (Ghio 2007) EM. 36"

\$16.00

This great hybridizer continues 2 traditions - coming up with bang-on names, and introducing excellent reds. See the photo on **page 11**, and why we so admire *Red Skies*' ideal form, with its wide ruffling. A small blue-purple effusion beneath the gold beards punctuates the otherwise uniformly gorgeous red. HM '09. AM '11.

SHARP DRESSED MAN (Johnson 2010) M. 36"

\$14.0

Sharp Dressed Man stands out in the garden. A passing gaze fixes on it. See our photo on **page 11**. The combination of the smooth black-violet falls, and the extremely attractive purple standards spells "infatuation". Monster bright orange beards provide brilliant contrast. Show stalks. Sweet fragrance. HM '12. AM '14.

WHITE HOT (Tasco 2008) EM. 37"

\$24.00

The glowing persimmon beard garners attention in this smooth and stylish white beacon. Its fine form, lemon dusting on the haft, and outstretched falls mark it as not just another white. Reach for the oven mitts. Large blossoms and high bud count. See our photo **page 11**. Slight fragrance. HM '10. AM '12.





SING A SONG (Schreiner 2008) EML. 42"



This plicata's striking broad ruffled falls are marked with a distinct 1/2" stitched perimeter of carmine red as shown in our illustration above. The standards repeat the same theme with a redder flush. The ground color presents a superb contrast of snowy white. Each lofty stem has three to four branches and proudly displays 11 to 14 buds.

DRIFTING (Schreiner 2011) M. 40"

The light airiness of this impeccable blue amoena will freshen up your garden. Billowing white standards perfectly complement the elegantly ruffled hyacinth blue falls, as shown in our photo **below**. Held on 40" stems, its 4 1/4" x 6" flowers dominate the floral landscape. The stem habit is also splendid with three to four branches displaying 9 to 12 buds on each stalk.



SORDID LIVES (Johnson 2009) EM. 41"

Sordid Lives illustrates the attraction of temptation. Besides blazing a new trail in color classes, this exciting Iris reflects pleasure. The falls' personality is self-evident with festive striations overlaying the attractive red mixed with yellow. A quarter inch yellow border, as shown in our photo **above**, lends the perfect finishing touch to the inviting falls. Contrasting snow white standards feature a precise wire of gold on the edges. Its large blossoms and high bud count are guaranteed to attract the paparazzi. HM '11. AM '13.

BETTER THAN BUTTER (Black 2010) EML. 41"

\$20.00

We scoffed. Better than butter? THIS Better Than Butter is convincing. Soft yellow hues land everywhere with a light touch. Silky white standards are flaxen fringed as our photo illustrates on page 13. And the white ground of the shapely falls are flushed with dulcet yellow veining. Finally, Better Than Butter displays substance, robust growth, and a slight musky fragrance, proving it's the real thing. HM '12. AM '14.

ELIZABETHAN AGE (Baumunk 2005) EM. 33"

\$17.50

Elizabethan Age won the prestigious 2013 Wister Medal, and continues to capture eyes from across the garden. The form is very good. Light purple standards lighten to apricot on the periphery. Light veinations overlie the darker purple open falls. Typical of luminatas, attention is pulled inward by the white blaze surrounding the yellow beard, and the warm style arms, as you see in our photo on page 13. Good growth habits. HM '07. AM '09. WM '13.

MAGICAL (Ghio 2008) EM. 37"

Magical is garnering rave reviews as one of the "most gorgeous light pink Iris on the market today. It makes a spectacle in the garden, and almost every stem is a show stem." - Tempo Two Iris Gardens. "Branched and budded stalks with flowers that remain fresh for 4 days. Headed for the top." - Rockytop Iris Gardens. Check out our photo on page 13 and marvel at the incredible ruffling and charming, light pink coloration. HM '10. AM '12. WM '14.

MONTMARTRE (Keppel 2008) EM. 33"

\$14.00

Imagine the bustle and excitement of Paris in your own garden! Rollicking ruffles electrify this bishop's purple luminata, as shown in our photo on page 13. Note the pale straw rim that energizes the ruffles, evoking a boisterous can-can line. HM '10. AM '12. WM '14.

TUSCAN SUMMER (Keppel 2010) M. 38"

From the hybridizer of Dykes Medal winner Drama Queen, comes an even more fiery red plicata. Sunshine yellow overlays the falls and slightly permeates the standards in a most captivating manner. As the photo on page 13 illustrates, Tuscan Summer's excellent substance is borne out by the fantastic flaring falls. HM '12. AM '14.





TUNNEL VISION (Keppel 2010) EM. 38"

\$20.00

This unusual plicata is emblematic of the light at the end of the tunnel. It's noteworthy for the uniform darkness - black-purple, except for a creamy splash on the falls. Pictured **above**, mustard beards inject personality. Mr. Plicata's Tunnel Vision brings us closer to the black plicata. HM '12.

BLACK MAGIC WOMAN (Tasco 2008) EM. 34"

Supernatural or not, the power of Black Magic Woman can mesmerize. Fuchsia red violet standards hide their secrets, while below, rounded jet black falls smolder. See the photo **below**. Persimmon orange beards warn us - this is not an Iris to turn our backs on. Intensely saturated colors make this a splendid addition to any garden. Very slight fragrance. HM '10. AM '12. WM '14.

SUN SHINE IN (Keppel 2010) EM. 35"

\$18.00

Allow Sun Shine In's warmth to envelop you, with its comforting embrace. Lovely lemon yellow standards wonderfully complement the softer falls, with their pale, almost white centers, as you see in our photo above. Sun Shine In will reward you with plenty of branches and buds. HM '12. AM '14.

TOMCAT (Lauer 2005) ML. 37"

\$14.00

Tomcat's pronounced tan-rose veinations and lustrous orange beards gently contrast with the subtle blue medial stripes and precise buff border on the falls. Oyster gray falls are gently inflected with rose tones. Adding dimension is the orange style arm and crest, as shown in our photo **below**. Pronounced sweet fragrance. HM '07. AM '09.





\$32.00

DOWNTOWN BROWN (Schreiner 2013) ML. 40"

Huge flowers, and its less common color scheme initially attract. Sealing the deal are the two shows it puts on, both attractive: on first bloom brown falls and buff-yellow standards appear. Stage 2, a few days later, after fading - is more attractive, the falls lightening to gold, as the photo **above** shows. Downtown Brown has 40" stalks and 8 flowers per stem.

UP IN FLAMES (Johnson 2010) M. 37"

What a lush color scheme! And isn't the proportion and form, with the fantastic ruffling and laciness, simply over the top? Start with the rococo rose standards. Smoldering orange beards on seductive red-violet falls raise the temperature, as exhibited in our photo **below**. Up In Flames burns with a sweet fragrance.

OUI MADAME (Schreiner 2013) EM. 37"

\$38.00

Qui Madame opens as a deeper lavender, then fades to a feminine laced lilac. This Iris is a standout in our garden and is marked with heavy substance and vigor. The large bright orange beard adds the perfect finishing touch. 8-10 buds on 37" stalks, blooms early.

WHO NEEDS A PRINCE (Schreiner 2013) M. 40"

\$28.00 A Who Needs a Prince offers a unique color combination, in which the yellow zonal pattern and beard predominate. The melding of lemon yellow standards and plum violet falls makes for an unusual variegata. Very tall - 40", it has heavy substance and big flowers.







CLOUD BALLET (Lyle Fort 1990) M. & RE. 34"

\$7.50

Cloud Ballet's classically formed flowers boast heavy ruffles and lace, and the azure petals lighten at their centers, complementing the yellow-tipped white beards. Good growth, sweet fragrance and occasional rebloom distinguish this Northwest origination as a winner. See photo **above**. HM '93.

COOL RUNNING (Schreiner 2003) ML. 39"

\$7.50

A fast grower, this tall vigorous medium aquamarine blue self literally bubbles like a mountain brook in the High Sierras. Its large round flower has a very clean haft and a white beard tipped with blue. Our illustration **above right** of a three-branched stem with two flowers in full bloom barely captures this wonder's effervescence. Make your garden a showcase with our ruffled blue innovation.

WILLAMETTE MIST (Schreiner 2001) ML. 39"

\$7.5

The billowing ruffled flowers of this Iris seem to roll in like Pacific clouds on a foggy day. Most remarkable though is how the upper petals of these blossoms are colored a distinctly deeper shade of wisteria blue than the falls-making a delightful "reverse amoena" pattern, as seen in our photo **at right.** This eye catching child of *Jazz Me Blue X Blue Crusader* has a very thick 3/4" stem and yields 6-8 buds per stalk.

ABSOLUTE TREASURE (Tasco 2006) M. 42"

\$14.0

This gem bespeaks Abundance! There is a fullness, a healthy bursting forth, in this heavily ruffled, sky blue self. Standards are sky blue and the falls are slightly lighter in the center. The white beards are tipped gold. See this tall and fragrant knockout on **page 16**. HM '08. AM '10. WM '13.

BLUE MY MIND (Schreiner 2014) L. 35"

\$35.00

This heavily ruffled cerulean purple-blue is a few tones lighter than its parent *Cape Perpetua*. Reminiscent of *No Count Blues*, the falls are heavily flushed with a cerulean blue-violet, as displayed in our photo on **page 16**. *Blue My Mind* grows robustly and blooms late in the season.

MILES AHEAD (Schreiner 2010) EM. 37"

\$12.50

This prizewinner is a descendant of *Above the Clouds X Can't Touch This*. Its humongous 4½ x 6½ inch flowers are copiously ruffled. Note in our photograph on **page 16** the fascinating melding of azure blue and ivory white in the center of each fall, a distinctive mottled coloration reminiscent of Iris ensata. Standards are a spic 'n span white and have extra-thick substance. *Miles Ahead* is a sure showbench champion. HM '14.

SEA OF LOVE (Lauer 2005) EM. & RE. 33"

\$12.50

Sea of Love contributes to advances made in the lavender-blue reverse amoena category. A paler version of *Crowned Heads*, its understated poise with icy-white lavender petals provides irresistible appeal. See this finely sculpted, pleated and enticing offer on **page 16**. With a bow to its namesake, the R & B hit of the 50's, this one also has what it takes. HM '08.

TEMPTING FATE (Meek 1993) ML. 34"

\$7.50

You'll be dazzled by *Tempting Fate's* stunning color contrast. This almost black amoena's arched pale blue-violet standards are a sharp counterpoint to the purple-black falls. Vigorous growth is a bonus. Pictured on **page 16**. HM '95.





JALLAB (Keppel 2004) EM. 22" (Arilbred)

\$15.00

This eye-catching red-brown Arilbred amoena has open falls, and Mohrtype form. Attractive red-brown falls make for both an unusual color combination, and a beautiful one - with greyed, sun-flecked standards. Enticing yellow style arms add to the luster, along with the yellow beards and starburst on the falls. See our photo at right. HM '06. AM '09.

ALL ABOUT SPRING (Kerr 2006) ML. 36"

\$16.00

Truly an impressive and unusual Iris. The longer we look at it, the more we like it. Ruffling and form are nonpareil, as the photo **below right** shows. Muted yellow banding encircles each petal. Crucial is the degree of lavender. At a glance it can be overlooked. Discovering it is a genuine pleasure. A clump of All About Spring, with its 7 ½ inch blossoms and a slight sweet fragrance, is hard to beat. HM '09.

LOVELY SEÑORITA (Schreiner 2002) ML. 41"

\$7.50

Our Lovely Señorita's flaming Mikado orange standards and burnt mars orange falls suggest the excitement of a flamenco dancer. Tall ramrod-stiff four-branched stems unfurl 10-15 buds per stalk. See this uniquely colored orange bitone pictured below right. HM '04. AM '08.

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


Reblooming Iris

Bearded Iris bloom in the spring. Some varieties, though, have a genetic tendency to bloom a second time, usually in the late summer or fall. These Iris have been called "Remontant" or "Reblooming" Iris. A repeat bloom later in the summer or fall often depends on geographic location, climatic conditions and gardening practices. Look for images with the "Reblooms!" flag throughout the catalog. But remember remontancy is NOT guaranteed. Check our website for more details on growing Reblooming Iris.

BEST BET (Schreiner 1988) E. & RE. 36"

\$7.50

Light wisteria blue standards sharply contrast the deep hyacinth blue falls in this floriferous bitone. It often produces two to three stems per plant early in the bloom season and then tends to bloom again in the fall. This child of Titan's Glory combines the vigorous growth habits and flower size of its parent with its own distinctive color pattern. See our photo **below left**. HM '90. AM '93.

BUCKWHEAT (Byers 1989) EML. & RE. 36"

As Its clean light yellow blossoms bloom throughout the spring bloom season and then reappear in the summer as well! With slight sweet fragrance and understated ruffles, its appeal is irresistible. See for yourself in our photo on page 21.

MAGICAL ENCOUNTER (Schreiner 1999) EML. & RE. 35"

Magical Encounter's intense pink cast is finished with warm shrimp pink tones that do not fade. Bright salmon pink beards further enhance this tantalizing effect, demonstrated in our photo on page 21. Four branches with 7-14 blooms guarantee constant spring bloom. HM '02.

ROSALIE FIGGE (McKnew 1993) M. & RE. 39"

This dark reddish violet self offers great growth and bloom habits. Its moderately sized flowers have a slight ruffle and are completely saturated in dark reddish purple (see one pictured on page 21). HM '96. AM '99.

SWEPT OFF MY FEET (Schreiner 2014) EM. & RE. 32" \$42.00

Although Swept Off My Feet does not stand as tall as some at 32", its garden impact is unequivocal. Soft orchid standards are rounded and well proportioned. Falls are rounded as well, and have a clean, modest border, as our photo on **page 21** displays. The color on the band of this rosy plicata is slightly deeper than the standards. Large orange beards enhance the alluring white falls, making this early-blooming Iris a timeless edition to your garden.

TOTAL RECALL (Hager 1992) EML. & RE. 36"

\$7.50

Total Recall's delicate coloring totally belies its incredible bloom habits. This delicately tinted pearly white, pictured **above left**, blooms well each spring. Its crowning distinction is that it strongly blooms a second time throughout the summer and fall. It has vigorous growth to match this effusive bloom habit.



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MAGICAL GLOW (Schreiner 2003) M. 40"

\$7.50

Magical Glow will capture your eye from across the garden with its flaming color and brilliant tangerine beards. See in our photo **below** how the gargantuan (4 ½" x 6½") flower literally burns with fiery hot tones of orange coming from its ancestors, Fireside Glow and Good Show. Its tall and thick stems easily support 7-9 flowers per stalk, making each clump an absolutely stunning display of floral magic.

BERRY SCARY (Black 2006) EM. 38"

\$18.00

Berry Scary has a lot going on. As our photo **below** illustrates, it features outstanding form, with broad ruffled, upcurving falls. Its bewitching color show boasts a spicy fragrance as well. The falls grab attention. At the center the red-purple is deepest. The ½" rims and undersides lighten to a purple-streaked buff hue, and buoyantly along for the ride is the signature orange beard. HM '09.





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AMIABLE (Ghio 2002) ML. 36"

\$14.00

Seductively appealing and beautifully formed, Amiable has both power and refinement as shown in our photo above. Pale pink furling standards, orange beards and subtly trussed falls, add up to a compelling presence. HM '04. AM '06.

CENTER ICE (Ghio 2010) VE.-E. 32"

A simply breathtaking Iris, with ideal form - big and ruffled, and an intoxicating chromatic package. As the photo **below** shows, Center Ice is white, with a subtle purple tinting. The standards, the beard and the heart of the falls follow this pattern. Around the rim of the falls is a watercolor-like infusion of rose-purple. This early bloomer heralds the opening of bloom season. HM '12. AM '14.

FEUDALISM (Ghio 2008) EML. 38"

\$16.00

A fascinating bitone. The heart of its beauty is enjoying the wonderful center, where the orange beards, on the deep violet falls, are in proximity with the lovely maroon midribs of the standards. It's this mélange - the orange, with the deep violet and the maroon inflecting the alabaster, that makes the sale, both for novelty and sheer beauty. Our photo above shows Feudalism's suede finish and large, chiseled form. High bud count. HM '11.

MOONLIT WATER (Keppel 2005) EML. 36"

Deep lavender-violet shadings overlay this luminata's white ground, imparting an ethereal effect, as evidenced in our photo below. Moonlit Water is one of the first Tall Bearded Iris to bloom each season. In addition its large generously ruffled flowers are produced in multitude, as each stem bears 9-10 double-socketed buds. HM '07.

ALL ABOUT BLUE (Schreiner 2009) ML. 40"

All About Blue definitely has one of the bluest hues of any Iris we know, see for yourself in our picture on page 24. This clear cadet blue self is much more intensely colored than its parent, Above the Clouds. Each of the 4 ½" wide falls has very ruffled form, excellent substance and an immaculate white beard. Its tall 40" stems tower above other varieties during the mid-to-late bloom season.

AMERICAN CLASSIC (Schreiner 1996) EML. 36" \$7.50

American Classic boasts great breadth and copious ruffling, as shown in our photo on page 25. Thick deep blue-violet plicata markings deftly edge the immaculate white ground, giving a sharp color contrast. Each vibrant stem consistently produces four branches and 11 to 13 buds. HM '98. AM '01.

FAME AND GLORY (Schreiner 2011) L. 37"

This stunning neglecta sports large 6" x 4" flowers. Its fascinating oyster-white standards nicely complement the inky purple falls. Each ruffled fall gleams with a velvety finish and lightens to a 1/4" rim of violet purple on the edges, as shown in our picture on page 25. Fame and Glory, like its sibling Midnight Treat, is also graced with classically arched standards.

GYPSY ROMANCE (Schreiner 1994) ML. 37"

CAPTAIN'S CHOICE (Schreiner 2009) EM. 35"

Here we have a novelty that contrasts pure icy white standards against dusky slate blue falls which lighten at their edges. Note in our picture on page 66 that the large six-inch flowers are rounded and have a pleasant ruffle on their edges.

CORAL SUNSET (Schreiner 1990) ML. 37"

Coral Sunset has a heart-warming impact. Its moderately sized flowers are finished in luscious pink-apricot tones lightening to creamy white with bright tangerine beards completing the ensemble. It's a robust grower, producing 6-7 buds on three branches. See our photo on **page 66**. HM '93. AM '97.

FRIMOUSSE (Cayeux 2000) ML. 33"

This admirable French import, pictured on page 66, features a tantalizing combination of colors. Bright tangerine beards combine with peach colored standards and raspberry falls resulting in a sensual display.

GREAT SMOKEY DAWN (Schreiner 2012) ML. 40"

Brown and purple have never melded so well. The ruffled, pleated falls are a deeper lilac, with a pronounced 1/4" brown border, and a mere wisp of gold thread at the edge. HERE COMES THE SUN (Schreiner 2007) ML. 36"

HOLLYWOOD NIGHTS (Duncan 2001) M. 32"

A Intense deep purplish black color completely saturates the heavily ruffled and laced petals of this wildly popular Iris (HM '03, AM '05, WM '08). A small white spray pattern surrounding the beards adds focus, as demonstrated in our photo on page 67.

JAZZ FESTIVAL (Schreiner 1990) ML. 40"

OH SO YUMMY (Black 2007) M. 36"

A comforting soft peach coloring permeates Oh So Yummy. The muted opalescence in the center of the falls sets the stage for showy orange beards. Large flowers and 2-3 branches on tall stalks lend starpower to this creation, as shown in our photo on page 66. HM '10.





Sense Gracchus' irrepressible spirit in our photo below right. Its arched standards are cleanly finished in medium yellow. The flared white falls are heavily overlaid with deep violet veinations. These pert and charming flowers are produced in abundance, as it often yields multiple stems per root.
