1° — Customers of the United States and Canada are instantly requested to join an importing licence to their kind orders and to avoid dispatching troubles, to observe it strictly.

ADRESS. — Customers should write clearly, stating full postal address and nearest Railway Station.

DELIVERY. — Prices given in this list are for plants at our Nursery, packing is not included but will be charged at cost price. Carriage is also an extra charge and all goods travel at buyer's risk.

BEST TIME OF DELIVERY. — We respectfully advise our customers from over sea, Great Britain, Canada, United States of America and Colonies, to send their commands as early as they can, if possible not later than May or June, so as to permit us to start shipping from the beginning of July.

PACKING, EXPORT and SHIPPING DEPARTMENT. — We take the greatest care to the packing, this done by skilful expert men, for years we have sent thousands of plants all over the world, and we have not heard yet any complaints due to bad packing.

To ensure this, we have made our duty to inspect personally every plant and the way they are packed before any consignment leave our nurseries; we feel confident that our clients will have the benefit of our long experience in this matter.

PAYMENT. — To all orders from abroad a cheque for the same value must be remitted meantime. Failing this rule the order will not be executed.

All invoices are strictly net. If a balance of an invoice has not been paid within three months of delivery, we shall take the leave to draw on our customer for the amount without further notice unless they advise us to the contrary.

CHEQUES. — New customers should sent cash with order. All cheques must be drawn on Paris preferably on « Société Générale ». Any cheques payable in American, English or Canadian places are not negociable and will be returned. We beg our honourable clients to date their chèques in full letters, not in cipher.

FORWARDING BY PARCEL POST. — Unless customers particularly desire, consignments of plants will not be sent by parcels post, for if such parcels from any cause fail to reach their destination, they are returned to us, usually after a considerable time, which renders plants useless. Customers who wish plant sent by parcels post must therefore take full responsibility for safe delivery.

CLAIMS. — Plants should be examined immediately on receipt and any complaints as to condition should be reported at once as, complaints made time after receipt cannot be entertained.

NOTA-BENE. — All plants are offered subject to being unsold on receipt of order and if any plants are not included in a shipment, this shall be no ground for any claims or refusal to receive the goods.

**Maman Millet** (MILLET). — Issued from a cross between Japanese and China, exceedingly vigorous with strong rigid stem and excellent habit. The enormous bud on the expending stage is of the sweetest soft pink, which on opening turn out to a solid white with a faint touch of fleshrose; the petals in the center large, irregular and waved with a crowning tuft of bright golden stamens; the guard petals keep an exquisite carmin-rose tint of a most attractive effect. A great acquisition indeed.

S. rosy mauve flushed soft reddish brown very obviously striated yellowish brown at the base F wide light soft plum violet paling gradually to mauve at the edges conspicuous yellow beard very fragrant. A refined flower of rosy effect and of great damtiness.

**Alcyon** (CAY). — A pure white very free flowering variety with reticulation, at the throat, spreading rounded falls, beard yellow, stems very firm, height 2½ feet. Variety specially recommended for borders, groups.
