Collections of Seedlings of Standard or Named Varieties

Every year about June 15 many surplus irises are dug in my garden to make room for new plantings. Some of these are my own seedlings, others are standard named varieties selling for 25c to 50c per root.

After digging, the roots are thoroughly mixed so as to distribute throughout the whole collection the various colors and varieties. Seedlings, however, are not mixed with the named varieties, but each group is kept separate. Bags or boxes are then prepared, each containing twenty-five roots. These will be sold during the summer of 1933 at \$1.00 each, delivered at the garden or shipped by express, charges collect.

These collections are recommended for landscape decoration, or for starting an iris garden at the lowest possible cost. The purchaser is advised to secure a number of these bags in order to have a sufficient supply for a satisfactory beginning. Orders may be given at any time, but delivery will be made only between June 15 and July 1. Payment is expected before delivery.
