Dear Iris Friends,

This, as you know, is an exciting year for fanciers in Utah for we are to play host for the American Iris Society convention. We have made good plans for a fine event, keeping our fingers crossed that "dame nature" may be kind, yet we know full well if she is to "pull some rough stuff" she will do it this year—it never fails in a convention year! We have had, to say the least, an "unusual" open winter, for the most part, and as I write this, in early March, one would think spring had arrived. Well over 150 hybridizers have sent guests for this convention. We know many an unknown hybridizer will be "discovered" and we will learn, again, that it is not necessary to have a wealth of experience to breed and produce good iris. With the advent of Snow Flurry, Great Lakes and Pink Formal breeding good seedlings is rather a simple thing, and the quality of seedlings year after year goes upward. I listed the three iris above for I have just recently had a note from our Registrar after she had completed her annual unofficial check-up of the parents most often used and they were in the order given. Naturally I am proud of the record Pink Formal is making as a parent. Then I get letters occasionally from someone telling me of a good seedling they have produced using some other "Tell" iris. For instance, Mrs. Ray Palmer of Missouri tells me of a seedling from Tosca x Sea Lark that has blue standards and white falls, and we know she has a real break. Slides of Mrs. Palmer's selections showed she had accomplished good things, yet it was 1953 before she had anything worthwhile. Her Snow Flurry x Miogem seedlings were lovely, and those from Helen McGregor, Mirror Lake, Faught 55 L 1, Chivalry, Cahokia, Blue Valley and Pink Formal were all marked with quality, and one from Snow Flurry x I. Hoogiana in a violet with very wide parts that should produce quality—its blood has been infused into some of the Helen McGregor lines and some fine things should result.

How lucky modern iris hybridizers are to have such good things to work with. The ground work crossing the species and getting the color-breaks was a long, hard process. Today one need have only a dozen of these known good breeders to raise seedlings as good as the experienced hybridizer is getting. Of course, some of the hybridizers will have lines that will be distinct and not available to most of us and they may still retain a lead in certain colors. Some beginner may, however, use an iris related and get similar breaks. In fact, it is quite likely an amateur may use two iris that have been crossed time and time again and produce better than anything that has previously come from such a cross. If we build on the success of others we are sure of success, however, and there is no fun like that of producing a good seedling.

Sometimes I wonder if iris fanciers are not tired of my catalog, cluttered up with pedigrees, and then I get letters from a good many who urge to continue this type of listing, or I get a letter from Twyla Olmstead of Washington, who opens her heart to write of the joy my catalog has brought to her and to tell of the desperate struggle she had made in making a come-back from a long series of operations for Cancer, and how, through her love of iris, she forced herself to drag a pain-stricken body through the garden, and how, gradually, through her determination, she had made a wonderful recovery. Her keen sense of humor and ability to cartoon "herself" in various situations in the garden or in bed poring over iris catalogs—showing a coffee-cup at the side of her bed and α couple of cats—one looking hopefully into an empty dish on the floor and the other, paws on bed, begging (catfully) for something to eat-gives one a lift in spirit. I have urged her to share this wonderful ability with the world, and, if she likes, to continue hybridizing for the joy she gets, and the hope of producing that future Dykes Medal winner. Or I get a letter from a fancier in Iowa who has been six months in the hospital and tells me she spends hours pouring over my catalog and how it kills the pain when the hypos fail. These things one cannot ignore. So I am back at making the "same old" catalog—even to the same size for I feel it is handier to carry about or for reference than the larger size.

Hardly a day passes that I do not get friendly letters from fanciers telling of their successes or failures, or sharing with me some of the things they have discovered in the growing of iris. Mr. Carl Quadros of Sacramento, Calif., tells how he discovered the use of powdered skimmed milk as an excellent fertilizer for gladiolus and iris, as well as his method of composting, and then fertilizing the fields. Taking a quick look, last fall, at his new plantings showed that his methods give results.

This year I am devoting a few more pages to some new color for the catalog and am deleting the hybridizing hints. I feel that most of the iris fanciers have been getting my catalog for several years and know the mechanics of hybridizing, already, and that my comments throughout the catalog listings give my views as to a variety's potentialities as a parent. I still have a supply of the 1952 issue that may be had for 10c and this book gives quite a detailed lot of hybridizing information as well as listing some varieties that have since been dropped from the catalog.

In closing let me thank all who have ordered iris and seed from us in the past. We hope to continue to serve you in a pleasing manner. I would like to express appreciation, too, for all the letters received during the busy season that usually thank us for the plants and our service. Days are not always long enough for us to answer every letter, as we would like to, so I take this opportunity to let you know your letters of thanks, personal history, and iris news are appreciated and often give us a moment of relaxation from the necessary work.

Best wishes and may all have a superb iris season with lots of good seedlings, and promising crosses.

AMELITA (M. Albright). M. (Amigo x Melitza.) A fine wide, full, heavily-substanced violet neglecta. Mrs. Albright's object: to breed a neglecta with a tangerine beard. As yet Amelita has resisted hybridizing attempts so we feel it may have an upset number of chromosomes and if it is to produce will throw unusual things. Height 36 inches. Net.......\$10.00 ARDRUN (H. M. McLeod). E. (Artemis x Gudrun.) Huge purplish-red hybrid that is simply gigantic in size with very strong midribs—especially in falls that flare. A heavy, unusual, wide, brownish-black beard. Fertile pollen. Height 36 inches. H.C. '53. Net......\$20.00 BANNER BRIGHT (Luzon Crosby). M.-L. (Mellowglow x Sunset Serenade) x (Cascade Splendor). A focal point in any planting will be this novel and distinct new color—of rich orange-yellow buff self of large size and very wide parts. Vigorous and fast of growth. It cannot miss as a breeder. H.C. '53. Height 36 inches. Net\$20.00 BLACK TAFFETA (Gertrude Songer). M.-L. (Black Forest x 47-33: sister to Night Life.) We have, today, some very fine so-called blacks, but we feel this is well worthy of a place in any garden, and surely hybridizers will seek it out for its beautifully rich, smoothly finished dark black-purple self, even to the beard. Some ruffling at the hafts adds greatly to its individuality and charm. Good sized flowers on 34 inch stalks. Net\$20.00 BLUE FLIGHT (H. Frazee-M. Albright). M.-L. (The Admiral) x (Sister to Pink Salmon x Great Lakes). An unusually different blue with a darker self beard, possessing substance and quality that one might expect from its superb pedigree, and a pedigree that is, to say the least, novel. It should be useful to breed blue beards and to those breeding blues from the CONVENTION QUEEN (Muhlestein). M.-L. (Salmon Shell x Pink Fulfillment.) Very large, wide, heavily laced peach-pink with excellent substance. One of the best from this cross that gave some true pinks with pink beards. This should be an excellent parent. Heavy 40 inch stalks. H.C. '53. No. 51-51D. Net......\$35.00 DARK CHOCOLATE (George H. Murray). M. (Tobacco Road x Grand Marshal.) The name is very befitting this dark chocolate self that is free of any red tones. A large, wide, somewhat ruffled, heavily substanced flower. The color is such an advance in this class that it has created quite a sensation among the fanciers who have seen it. Height 38 inches. 7 to 9 buds. H.C. '53. Surely the best iris this fine hybridizer has yet named. Unusual in its coloring, we have seen nothing quite like it, and the substance is all one could want. The color is a light golden tan self, lighter around the falls, and a mother-of-pearl area in center of falls. Actually the flower defies description. With such a pedigree it should be able to produce anything: plicatas, blues, whites, yellow amoeanas, reds, yellows, tans and browns. Surely its children will be marked with quality. H.C. '53. HIGH HEAVEN (Gordon Plough). M. (Snow Flurry x Great Lakes.) The best light blue seedling I have seen from this superb cross. The flowers are wide, very heavily substanced and smoothly finished. High Heaven should be a top breeder for blues and white. Height 38 inches. Limited stock. Net...........\$25.00

KANAB (Luzon Crosby). E.-M. (Aztec Copper x Tobacco Road) x (Midwest Gem x Honeyflow). This tall stately reddish-brown with its heavy substance, flaring falls edged with gold, won the brown class at the 1953 Salt Lake City show of the Utah Iris Society and was awarded α C.O.C. as well as H.C. '53. Surely one of the best iris this hybridizer has produced. A superb pedigree for browns, coppers and rich blends. Limited stock.

MODESTY (Carl Taylor). M. (White Ruffles x Dr. Loomis' V 20.) In the yellow and white bi-color class. This one has most delightful charm and personality. Visitors to the Taylor garden were unanimous in its praise and chose it as the most beautiful iris of its coloring they had seen. With this breeding it should produce a host of fine seedlings in whites, blues, pinks, apricots, yellows, plicatas and other colors.

NEW ADVENTURE (Muhlestein). M. (Loomis plicata from Sea Shell x Pink Formal.) The pod parent was a small plicata with the tangerine beard. Knowing Pink Formal to be a derivitive of Sea Shell I crossed these together and one plicata of good size, carrying the tangerine beard, resulted. For the hybridizer New Adventure should be what its name implies for exploring the possibilities of better plicatas with "the beard" or for salmons and pinks with plicata markings as well as pinks, and various by-products we might expect from pink breeding. This is not a finished flower, by any means, for I think the shape leaves

something to be desired; however, it has size, good substance, a 36-inch well branched stalk, and is a vigorous grower. No. 51-56.

PINK FULFILLMENT (Muhlestein). M.-L. (47-72: Gold Ruffles x 45-64-1A: Alice Harding x Dr. Loomis' "Type Dore"—a Sea Shell seedling) x (Pink Formal). This is the pink that, like its parent 47-72, bloomed without increase and was numbered 49-11C, however, it later in the summer sent up one small blade of increase and I am now able to release a few rhizomes. Quite deep and rich in color, this pink has more quality and substance than its fine parent Pink Formal, and, of course, is much more of a true pink. It is proving one of the best breeders I have ever used, and I introduce two of its children this year. The flowers are large and have very heavy substance. The falls flare and are very full and round. H.C. '52. Height 38 inches. Limited stock. Net....\$35.00

 SIERRA SKIES (W. B. Schortman). E.-M. (Santa Barbara x Sierra Blue) x (Chivalry). In the medium blue class this is nearest spectrum blue of any bearded iris we have seen. The large, beautifully formed flowers are carried to perfection on heavy 38-inch stalks. We cannot praise this fine blue too highly. From a hybridizer who specializes in blues and the first, after long years of breeding, he felt confident was exceptional enough to name. Surely a superb first introduction. H.C. '53. It is a rich medium-blue self, standards slightly open and retain their position because of the superb substance of the flower. Already proven a magnificent breeder of blues and whites. With this breeding it cannot miss as a parent. Heavy 40 inch stalks make it a standout in any planting.

TALL BEARDED IRIS FOR 1954

After each variety is a code-number giving the location of a variety in my planting at Madsen's. S stands for SOUTH section between the two houses. SE is the section just east of this South section, E is for the EAST field planting. Row 1 is at the South—and the larger numbers run on North (toward the barn). N is the little planting North of the North home of Bert Madsen, and in this planting I give the row number as well as the section (one variety to the next) and the rows run East to West. Any iris in the catalog without a location indicated may be in the gardens at my home, at Willis Madsen's in Provo, or at the planting at Milton Holdaway's in Vineyard.

My plantings at Madsen's, in Vineyard, are at the 6th house South of the Vineyard Ward Chapel (Church) on the Lower Geneva Road. Holdaway's may be located by traveling North of the Vineyard Ward Chapel—turning left at the first lane running West. Go to the end of the lane—turn right—third house to the North. Visitors welcome at either of the Vineyard gardens; however, the new varieties and all but two or three guests have been planted at the Madsen farm, due to the fact that convention visitors will have an opportunity to visit only three plantings in the one day alotted to the Provo-Orem area. I have a few guests at Mrs. Samuel Crosby's and Mr. M. D. Wallace's in Orem, and we hope some will be in fine condition at one of the plantings during visits.


