Iris Terms

As Used in This Catalog

- AMOENA: White or lightly tinted standards and colored falls, which may be blue, purple, yellow or pink.
- **BEARD:** The conspicuous hairs borne on the center of the haft of the falls in bearded Iris.
- **BI-TONE:** Two tones of the same color. Ordinarily the falls are darker than the standards in a bi-tone.
- **BLEND:** A combination or mixture of two or more colors in the same parts of a flower, one color usually a shade of yellow.
- **HAFT:** The narrow constricted part of the petals near the center of the Iris flower.
- **ONCOBRED:** A hybrid of oncocyclus and tall bearded parentage, showing resemblances to both parents.
- **PLICATA:** Stitched or stippled or dotted margins of color on light backgrounds. Backgrounds range in color from white through creams to dark yellows.

SELF: A flower with standards and falls of the same color.

SUBSTANCE: Thickness of the petals.

TEXTURE: Sheen or finish of the petals.

VARIEGATA: An Iris with standards of any shade of yellow (cream, buff, yellow, orange, bronze, etc.) and the falls of a darker shade of tones of brown, purple or red.

FOREWORD - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

It is Iris time once again. With this, our seventh catalog, we wish to greet our many friends and customers and those of you whom we hope to serve in the coming years. The Iris is truly the "Queen of the flower garden, a rainbow come to earth." It is with both pride and pleasure that we offer you many new additions to our list.

Visitors to the gardens are more than welcome. Our blooming season is one of the latest, because we are located in the mountains, near the Canadian border. Peak bloom is usually reached the second week in June. You will find our gardens about thirty-six miles north of Colville, between Deep Lake and Cedar Lake. Come if you can and see nearly six acres in bloom. Iris collecting is our hobby. We are growing many of the older Iris here and many of the very latest Iris that are not listed in our catalog. In all, we have collected about 3000 varieties.

The Iris is a hardy plant and can stand more neglect than most flowers. But it does respond to good care. The ideal location for Iris is a sunny, well-drained position. They require at least a half day of full sun and resent continued "wet feet." Iris rhizomes will grow after being out of the ground for long periods of time. The green fans may wither away and the roots dry up but the bulbs are capable of growing replacements. In fact, if an Iris is transplanted directly from one location to another, they appear to sit and sulk for quite a while before beginning growth. But if they are out of the ground for several days or longer, they appreciate their new location and are conditioned to start growth immediately. Because the embryo bloom stalk for next year's bloom is formed in the Iris rhizome about a month after blooming season is over, the later in the summer that an Iris is transplanted the more likely it is to bloom the first year.

All Iris rhizomes are not alike, some are naturally large while others are very small. The size of the rhizome has nothing to do with the size of the blossoms. Wm. Mohr's bulb is no larger than the end of a woman's thumb, yet it has very large flowers. All part onco bulbs are usually small.

OUR DIGGING AND SHAPING SEASON WILL START THE 20TH OF JULY and will continue until the 15th of September. Please do not ask for or expect earlier shipment, because our later blooming season does not allow the Iris rhizomes to mature earlier. As far as possible, orders are filled in the order in which we receive them, unless a later date is specified. Hundreds of orders come in every week during March, April, May, June and July and it is physically impossible to fill them all the first week of the digging season. To insure as early shipment as possible, make your selections now and place your order early.

We ship only quality rhizomes, freshly dug, clean, labeled and well packed. They are guaranteed to be true to name. Because growing conditions in your locality are beyond our control, we cannot replace any Iris lost due to winter kill. During the last four years we have shipped Iris to

all 48 states and to Canada, Alaska and England. Our gardens are state inspected. We are a member of the American Iris Society and the British Iris Society. We like to do business with flower lovers and have found them to be a reasonable and appreciative group of people.

WE PAY THE POSTAGE. But postal rates and labor costs keep going up, so we have been asked to cooperate with other gardens by placing a thirty-five cent handling charge on all orders. As you know, it is the first pound of postage that costs the most. This fact has forced us to ask for a minimum order of \$3.50. We appreciate the way neighbors have been combining their orders to help with the postage problem.

- **POSTAGE BONUS** If you wish to include \$1.00 to help with the postage, in addition to the basic handling charge, you may choose extra irises worth \$1.50 as your postage bonus.
- BEGINNER'S COLLECTION If you are a beginner in Iris collecting and would like a lot of varieties for your money, send us \$3.50 and we will choose 15, all different, large flowered, named Iris for you. This collection will be labeled and contain a wide range of colors but cannot be shipped before the end of August, when we can determine what varieties we have in surplus.
- **BARGAIN COLLECTIONS** Choose your own collections from the list of "Harder to find Iris" in the back of the catalog. You may order any of the starred (*) varieties from that list—10 for \$4 or 20 for \$7.50. Or you may choose any 10 Iris for \$4 from the "Beginner's Bargain List" in the back of the catalog.
- **DELUXE COLLECTION** Choose your own collections from the list of "Exceptional Bargains List" we have placed in the back of the catalog. You may order 12 of these varieties for \$6 that ordinarily sell for \$1 or more.
- BONUS IRIS—We like to be generous with extra Iris as gifts. If your order is under \$5 we will select your bonus Iris for you. On orders between \$5 and \$10, you may choose 10% of the total in free Iris. On orders of \$10 or over you may select 15% of the total in free Iris. This is not a cash discount, but a bonus of free Iris and does not apply to the above collections or bargain lists.

Iris Originations of Melvina Suiter

We are happy to be able to list in our catalog, again this year, some of the newer Iris from Melvina Suiter of Eagle, Idaho. Mrs. Suiter is a hybridizer, who, for many years, has been going quietly about the work of creating beautiful new Iris that are outstanding for their color or color combinations, for their ruffling, lacy edges, satin texture, height, heavy substance or a combination of several of these qualities. Some of the Suiter Iris that are not listed but may be seen growing in our gardens are: Fairgold, Kristina, Nancy Jean, Spring Bouquet and Tri Valley. After the name of the Iris, we have listed the year of introduction, height, season of bloom, parentage and description.

1962 INTRODUCTIONS

- MOLKA POLKA—(Suiter 1962) 38" M-L (Patrice X Rich Raiment) A rich cream Plicata, dotted and stippled a rich coffee color. Beard is heavy and bronze colored, standards are closed, falls are nearly round and flaring, the branching is good.
- MT. BORAH—(Suiter 1962) 40" M-L (Snow Flurry X Last Snow) Completely white Iris except for chartreuse lines deep in throat. Its leathery substance, domed standards, round flaring falls, icy glitter and 4-way branching makes it look like a mountain of icy snow.
- ROSE POINT—(Suiter 1962) 48" M (Patrice X Rich Raiment) A white plicata with standards completely sanded and washed a deep rose. The falls are white, edged with a wide margin of rose dots that completely cover the hafts. The bronze beard is large and heavy. This Iris grows in size for three days and the blooms last nearly a week.
