- BRAWNY BILL (J. J. Taylor) 70-90 cm, ruffled and domed standards and recurved falls bright mulberry purple, veined and dotted darker; hint of violet signal at end of diffuse bronze beard; a fertile oncobred. (William Mohr X William Mohr x Capitola)----- \$ 17.50
- SPASIBO (J. J. Taylor) 40-50 cm, cool white lightly veined pale violet; medium violet triangular signal; texture and bright gold beard of pollen parent; a triploid regeliocyclus. (Ancilla X I. hoogiana)----- \$ 15.00

1975 Introductions

- BOLD BABE (J. J. Taylor) 60-70 cm, standards bamboo; falls rose-purple with burgundy thumbprints beside beards; unique Mohr-type arilbred. (Kiss Me Kate X Black Joppa)----- \$ 7.50
- KALISAF (J. J. Taylor) 60-70 cm, greenish standards veined bright yellow; yellow falls veined and washed red; electric blue blaze at end of beard. (Kalifa Gulnare X Saffron Charm)----- \$ 10.00
- MISS MONTANA (R. A. Diettert) 100-110 cm, heavily ruffled light yellow self; good branching, substance, bud count, and a good parent. (Snow Flurry X Happy Birthday)----- \$ 12.50

Seed-Grown Species and Hybrids

- I. aphylla - typically-branched, well-budded red-violet selections from numerous interclonal crosses----- \$ 1.75
- I. biglumis Oxyptala - attractive, large-flowered ivory and lavender bicolor; very hardy----- \$ 1.75
- I. binata - blue-violet miniature with bluish beards; putative hybrid between I. pumila and I. aphylla; fertile----- \$ 2.00
- I. chamaeiris - prolific and attractive blue-violet clone from Czechoslovakian crosses----- \$ 1.75
- I. cristata - from collected seeds of hardy eastern US native----- \$ 2.00
- I. graminea - fragrant, graceful, low-growing pink and violet spuria- \$ 1.75
- I. hoogiana - silky, lavender-blue regelia that grows well among the eupogons; seed-grown clones----- \$ 4.50
- I. imbricata - ten or more sulfur-yellow flowers on husky, well-branched 60-cm stems; from USSR collections----- \$ 2.00
- I. missouriensis - three clones available this season:
- Frontier Town - bright, crisp, ruffled western Montana clone----- \$ 2.00
- Pikes Peak - typical clone from about 3600 meters (12,000 ft)----- \$ 1.75
- Tol-Long - an oldtimer, but large and beautiful----- \$ 1.75

- Berlin Cream - novel mimosa yellow (RHS 8-B); thin red-brown "V"--- \$ 1.75

I. ruthenica - tiny violet "pilgrim"; likes afternoon shade----- \$ 3.50
I. setosa - blue-purple falls; pink styles; 20-30-cm stems----- \$ 2.00
I. unguicularis - light lavender-blue; grown as tender house plant
in this area----- \$ 1.75
I. versicolor - many nice pink clones for arrangements, breeding----- \$ 1.75
Seedling MD-4 - rich, blue-violet miniature; 3 flowers on modestly-
branched stem; fertile. (I. pumila X I. aphylla)----- \$ 2.50
Seedling H-49 - a dwarf, violet Vulcanus; 2 flowers on 20-30-cm stems;
partly fertile pod parent. (Green Spot X Vulcanus)----- \$ 3.00

DAINTY BLUEBELL (A. Brown 1971) 19", two-toned wisteria blue self with
yellow beard, graceful stems-----\$2.00
DAINTY BRUNETTE (A. Brown 1974) 24", tan and velvet brown bitone, orange
beard, outstanding as a garden clump-----\$4.00
DAINTY CLOUD (A. Brown 1969) 16", delightful white ground plicata, marked

pale blue dotting, very dainty-----\$1.50
ICE FAIRY (Witt 1962) 24", amoena, standards white, falls light lavender
blue; makes beautiful clumps-----\$1.50

OTAY (Snell 1973) 16", non-fading yellow and brown plicata; standards rich yellow-gold, falls white, edged yellow, marked red-brown-----\$3.00

OUTWARD BOUND (Witt 1969) 19", violet on white plicata, standards sanded and shaded, falls banded; beard yellow-----\$1.50

PALE WINGS (Witt 1966) 25", ruffled pale blue self, dainty and frilly, one of the few smooth blue MTB-----\$1.50

QUIRK (A. Brown 1971) 19", standards yellow, falls pale yellow striped red, ending with a dab of red at the tip--distinctive-----\$2.00

TILOURA (Witt 1969) 21", orchid on pale straw yellow plicata giving a definite pinkish effect; good flaring form, fine stems-----\$1.50

TONEEN (Snell 1973) 24", standards pale violet, darker midribs; falls medium purple with narrow border of pale violet; ruffled-----\$3.00

VARIBO (Snell 1973) 24", standards yellow, falls lighter yellow veined deep red-purple; terrific number of bloomstalks-----\$3.00

MTB, OLDER VARIETIES-----\$1.00

BLUE TRIMMINGS (blue bitone, velvety), FAIRY FLO (blue self), KALEIDOSCOPE (erratic plicata), HONORABLE (variegata), PEWEE (white), SANS SOUCI (variegata), SHERWIN-WRIGHT (yellow), SHERWIN-WRIGHT mutant (extra-yellow sectors), TID-BIT (blue), WIDGET (lavender/white plicata), QUAIL (short, open yellow plicata, like a late-blooming SDB).

SPECIES SAMPLER: one each Pacific Coast, Siberian, Spuria, plus two
American Natives, named and marked for color, selected for warm or
cold climates-----5 for \$7.50

I. wattii, Crested Section, ruffled lavender flowers on a 3 ft. bloom
stalk which rises out of a fan of large leaves at the top of a 2 ft.
corn-stalk stem--has to be seen to be believed! TENDER! Winter it in
heated frames or be prepared to take it indoors--well worth effort--\$3.00

I. japonica, sprays of frilly white crested blossoms, tinted violet,
evergreen foliage, not hardy in climates colder than Seattle-----\$1.75

I. colchica, low-growing Spuria, a form of I. graminea, red-violet
flowers rise clear of somewhat drooping foliage-----\$1.75

I. pseudocyperus, another form of I. graminea, red-violet flowers,
clonal material from Czechoslovakia-----\$1.75

I. sintenisii, small evergreen Spuria with spidery flowers of a vivid
blue-violet-----\$1.75

I. missouriensis, Western Blue Flag. Clones from both Western and
Eastern Washington-----\$1.75

I. versicolor, Eastern Blue Flag. Water-loving, hardy; blue, white,
wine-red; blue-fragrant.-----\$1.75

I. setosa, Alaska wild iris. Bright blue, ruffled flowers; also a
purple-flowered form from eastern Asia-----\$1.75

I. prismatica, like a delicate blue Siberian, water-loving, native to
Eastern U. S.-----\$1.50

I. unguicularis (I. stylosa) 'Speciosa'. Fragrant violet flowers with
purple-stained perianth tubes bloom in February. Mild areas only---\$2.00

Moraea spathacea, South African Irid, hardy in Seattle. Yellow flowers
in May from a small corm-----\$2.00
