As our political horizons expand, teaching time continues to decline. We now teach but two periods a day. Our growing political commitments to the citizens of Santa Cruz continues to take an ever expanding amount of our time. You are welcome at any time to visit the garden. We may not be here, but feel free to make yourself at home and "look 'em over." Most everything is now in the home gardens at 1201 Bay Street in preparation for the '78 National AIS Convention. Only our first year seedlings are growing at the 233 Rigg Street garden.

Pacifica and median bloom is best during the second week of April. Tall beardeds are in full bloom during the last week of April and the first week of May. Spurias, Siberians, and Louisianas begin blooming from about May 1 to near May 20.

If you desire a rare variety which we don't list, ask us about it for we may have a spare tucked away. If you receive a second copy of this catalog, pass it on to a friend, and send us the names of friends who would enjoy our listing.

TERMS

Bay View Gardens is known for its generosity. We enjoy sharing and will include extras of our choice in line with the size and type of order sent.

Please send check with your order. Order bearded and beardless irises separately. Handling charge for each type of order since they must be sent separately. California residents please add 6% sales tax.

Handling fees on bearded irises are as follows: California add \$1.25; \$1.50 for all other areas west of the Rockies and \$2.00 for areas east of the Rockies. Note additional charges in the Bargain Section. For special handling add an additional 50¢. Please check the beardless section for handling charges on them. We ship via UPS, but must have a street address rather than a post office or route number to use their service. Otherwise the slower postal service must be used.

Shipments begin in late June and continue into August. We will meet special shipping dates only within the month of July. Our orders are filled in rotation, so order early to avoid disappointment. We replant everything each year in late August-September; thus, the only items we can assure you of during that period are Surprise Packages.

Our plantings are extensive rather than intensive. No substitutions without permission (except on extras). If you would list some acceptable substitutes, it would save time in correspondence in this time of rising mailing costs. Immediate refund on items sold out.

UPWARD AND ONWARD

The year of our Nation's Bicentennial was memorable in all respects at BVG. Ghio introductions won 8 honorable mentions from the AIS including placing three in the top ten of the TB voting. Mystique was first runner-up in the HM voting as well as in the Judges' Choice voting. Four others placed in the JC voting, also. Old Flame was a runner-up in the Cook Cup voting in Michigan, and in Italy, Dialogue won the Priemo Firenze with Ghost Story the second runner-up. And in sales, Bicentennial became our third "Golden Rhizome." With this firm foundation, we present an even more exciting group of 1977 releases for your gardening pleasure.

COFFEE HOUSE. 38 inches, mid to late season.

We long felt that improvements in brown would come only through new avenues of breeding using the tangerine factor, and Coffee House proves it. From its maiden bloom, it was referred to as "The Brown." Huge broad form with light lace, splendid branching and bud-count that won't stop. It is a pure, unadulterated deep, rich coffee-brown. It inherited its growth habits and small, sparse-leafed rhizomes from its great grandparent, Denver Mint. #71-13S: 68-11OM* X (Tawny Mink x New Moon). EC '76.

CRUSHED VELVET. 40 inches, early to mid-season. \$25.00

Many long years ago, we set out to produce a pure red-violet in the modern style (an improved Patience). With this parentage you can see how long a trip it has been, but a very rewarding one. Lush red-violet standards with very broad red-violet falls lightening to near white in the center, giving that rich velvet-like effect. For accent, the beard is white; the stalks tall and erect; and the growth exemplary. #72-32S: (Mulberry Wine x ((Haunting Rhapsody x 62-171*) x ((62-171 x (59-114K* x Utah Valley)) x (Melissa x 59-114K)) X Warm Laughter.

ENTOURAGE. 40 inches, early to late season.

Regal royalty: Hazy rose-pink tone with a mother-of-pearl finish; very clear and luminous coloring. Extremely wide form with rippling pleated ruffling undulating around all the heavily substanced petals. The stalks are tall, stately, and sturdy. The placement is flawless with a bud-count of 9 or more. Tangerine beard and great vigor completes this very classy creation. As with a kingly entourage, this iris won't soon be forgotten. #72-68M: (Show Time x San Leandro) X 68-110W.

INTUITION. 33 inches, early to mid-season.

Some years back, a blue with a brown beard appeared among the seedlings. Six generations later, we have that break incorporated in a flower and plant which is up to modern standards of excellence. And this is excellent in a deep glowing, "Allegiance-blue" with semi-flaring form and gentle fluting. The beard is a striking greenish brown — nothing like it. Good branching and vigor that produces instant clumps completes this beautiful and unique creation. #71-137B: ((Frosted Starlight x Wizard sib) x (First Courtship x 59-114K)) x sib) x Shipshape.

New Moon and Denver Mint are the two most significant breeding irises on the current stage. They impart sterling form with a clearness of color not available before. Mandolin has generous amount of each of these two irises in its background, and it shows the benefits. Luminous creamy melon-apricot that just begs drooling over, and gave rise to its original name, "Sherbet." Wide broad form with heavy substance giving long lasting blooms. Large rhizomes, producing several stalks in one year. #71-40A: Georgia Girl X (Denver Mint x Ponderosa). EC '75.

INNER CIRCLE. 24 inches, Border Bearded, early to late season. \$15.00

With some of the finest bitone irises available today in its pedigree, a new zenith is to be expected, and Inner Circle will not disappoint you. Light blue with a deep glowing red-blue blot in the center of the falls, surrounded with a light blue margin of bubble-ruffling. Stunning and soul-satisfying. The rhizomes are small in proportion to the height. Branching and bud-count are without fault. #72-64Q: (Passport x Skylab) X Dialogue.

BOY WONDER. 20 inches, Intermediate Bearded, early season. \$12.00

We've been breeding SDB's and IB's for some time, but this is the first we consider good enough to release. Thanks to its Denver Mint heritage, Boy Wonder has the widest hafts of any IB with size and proportion. Burnt gold standards and burnished golden tan falls. A splendid bright delight. Show branching and long lasting blooms coupled with heavy bud count. #72-129E: (West Coast X Gingerbread Man).

We begin shipping SURPRISE PACKAGES at the end of our regular shipping season, approximately August 10 and continue until stock is depleted in September. Beardless Surprise Packages are also available for late September or October shipment.

Order irises in this section separately. Shipping irises from these classes require special care. The shipping charge is \$2.25 for areas east of the Rockies and \$1.75 for the areas to the west. Shipments begin to the more northern climes near September 1 and continue through the fall until replanting is complete — about the end of October.

PACIFICAS

Plant Pacificas in an acid bed. In harsh climates place them in a protected location and mulch during the winter. In all but coastal locations, filtered shade seems to provide the best results. Hold water to minimum levels during the summer months. Plant immediately upon receipt and keep them quite wet and shaded until the fall rains take over.

Fertilize with azalea food as the new growth begins in the spring and immediately after blooming.
