to "Golden State in '78", the AIS National Convention which will tour our garden on April 28, 1978. We look forward to greeting many of you in person and in anticipation dedicate our 15th annual catalog for your pleasure.

Our political duties continue to take up more of our time, this year as Mayor of Santa Cruz. You are welcome to visit the garden at any time. We may not be here, but feel free to make yourself at home and "look 'em over." Most everything is in the home garden at 1201 Bay St. Some 10,000 first year seedlings are at the 233 Rigg Street gardens which will not be toured during the National, but feel free to come before or after the Convention to look these over. We are only 35 miles from San Jose off Highway 1, in West Santa Cruz.

Pacifica and median bloom is best during the second week of April. Tall bearded are in full bloom during the last week of April and the first week of May. Spurias, Siberians, and Louisianas begin blooming from about May 1 to near May 20.

If you desire a rare variety which we don't list, ask us about it for we may have a spare tucked away. If you receive a second copy of this catalog, pass it on to a friend, and send us the names of friends who would enjoy our listing.

TERMS

Bay View Gardens is known for its generosity. We enjoy sharing and will include extras of our choice in line with the size and type of order sent.

Please send check with your order. Order bearded and beardless irises separately. Handling charge for each type of order since they must be sent separately. California residents please add 6% sales tax.

Handling fees on bearded irises are as follows: California add \$1.25; \$1.50 for all other areas west of the Rockies and \$2.00 for areas east of the Rockies. Note additional charges in the Bargain Section. For special handling an additional \$.50. Please check the beardless section for handling charges on them. We ship exclusively by UPS, but for faster delivery we need a street address and/or phone number rather than a post office box or a route number.

Shipments begin in late June and continue into August. We will meet special shipping dates only within the month of July. Our orders are filled in rotation, so order early to avoid disappointment. We replant everything each year in late August-September; thus, the only items we can assure you of during that period are Surprise Packages.

Our plantings are extensive rather than intensive. No substitutions without permission (except on extras). If you would list some acceptable substitutes, it would save time in correspondence in this period of rising mailing costs. Immediate refund on items sold out.

In 1977, Ghio introductions received 11 honorable mentions from the AIS, including the top vote getters in both the TB and Pacifica balloting. Five placed in the Judges' Choice including 2 of the top 3 TB's: #1 Mystique and #3 Bicentennial. Mystique is the highest rated (#19) newcomer to the Popularity Poll voting. Copy Cat received an Award of Merit, and in sales, Coffee House became our fourth Golden Rhizome. With this strong base, we now present our exciting and unique 1978 releases for your enjoyment.

ARTISTE. 38 inches, mid to late season. \$25.00

The garden name was "Brandy Peach", but it is so spectacularly different that a more expansive name was called for. There is no comparable variety on the market today. A large bloom with deep brandy peach standards; the wide full-formed falls are bluish white with an edge of brandy peach as are the shoulders. The beard sets off the unique combo with its deep brick-red color. Lots of buds. Sparsely leaved rhizomes which multiply rapidly. #73-9D: (Magic Potion sib x Sabre Dance) X ((Amigo's Guitar x Clairvoyance sib) x (Ponderosa x Opening Round)). Best Sdlg., San Jose, 1977.

BURGUNDY CHERRY. 36 inches, middle to late season. \$25.00

You can be sure when you see one of our ice cream series of names, that you are in for a luscious treat, and Burgundy Cherry will leave you drooling. Here we have a very rich burgundy wine with fluting and ruffling galore; qualities unknown in this class before. Fantastic show branching with buds all over the place. This is one of the bases of the very ruffled red line we're working on. #72-107S: (Royal Trumpeter X French Vanilla).

FLAREUP. 38 inches, early to late season. \$25.00

Already our Ponderosa line is recognized as at last providing the long sought breakthrough in brown breeding making the class now comparable with what we expect in other advanced classes as the blues and the pinks. Flareup is defined by its name; An absolutely horizontal flaring bloom with hafts that overlap and tightly closed and held standards. Multi-budded with show stalks and substance like marble. Opens a mid-brown and slowly becomes an absolutely yummy creamed coffee color. Clean, unique and always attractive. It is nicely ruffled with even some lace! #73-24V: Coffee House sib X ((Ponderosa x Travel On) x Ponderosa)).

MAGNIFIQUE. 40 inches, early to mid-season \$25.00

With a name like Magnifique, this iris must be something special; and it must be for it is much discussed and sought-after as witnessed by a long waiting list of orders. The heaviest waxiest substance of any iris with the most opaque chalk-white crowned with a red beard, tipped white. Absolutely no yellow in the color as others in this class have had. A surefire show winner for it always has 3, 4, or even 5 open with perfect placement. With its substance, the bloom lasts for days. Floriferous and shows the versatility of the Ponderosa line. #73-23G: ((Ponderosa x Debby Rairdon) x (Ponderosa x New Moon)) X Carved Cameo. EC and HC '77.

PREMONITION. 32 inches, mid to late season. \$25.00

The maiden bloom of Premonition created as much excitement as the debut of Mystique in 1971. The waiting list is already long. If you love Mystique, this one will surely drive you out-of-your-mind. A new zenith for the class: Light blue standards with the Mystique flush; they dome and are ruffled. The nearly horizontal falls are a velvety glowing deep blue with a wide wavy edge of light blue. Striking and stunning like the amoenas of the olden days. Quite floriferous and vigorous. No wonder it has a long list of pre-introduction awards including Best Sdlg., EC '76, '77, and HC '77. #73-65F: (Copy Cat X Mystique).

SAN JOSE. 38 inches, middle to late season. \$25.00

Quite fitting the Spanish heritage of the Headquarter's City of the 1978 National AIS Convention. The beautifully domed standards are a caramel brown with the same tone washed over the wide and semi-flaring violet based falls. Wide branching with multi-buds per socket and fine placement. Very ruffled and laced with the luminosity found in glads and tuberous begonias. #73-26I: Coffee House X ((Ponderosa X Travel On) x Peace Offering)).

LOVER BOY. 24 inches, Intermediate Bearded, early to late \$10.00

Sexy crimson-red with a silken finish. Tremendously vigorous that it produces several well-branched stalks in a season. A very heavily budded item that it begins blooming with the IB's and it is still around to greet the late TB's. #72-137C: (Gingerbread Man X Starburst).

At the end of the season we dig and replant all of our stock. We are left with surplus rhizomes of many fine recent varieties. We want to share these with you. Send us a sum of money (\$15, \$20, \$25, or whatever, and we will send you irises with a minimum LIST value of four times (and more likely more times) the monetary value which you send us. We begin shipping SURPRISE PACKAGES at the end of our regular shipping season, approximately August 10, and continue until stock is depleted in September. Beardless Surprise Packages are also available for late September or October shipment.

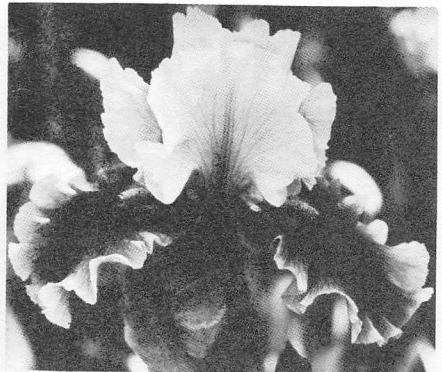

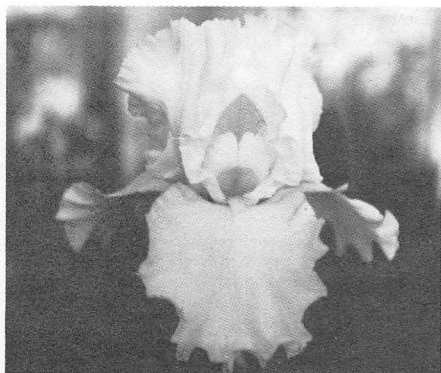

Prepare their bed with plenty of humus—compost, peat or redwood compost—some 4-6 weeks before you expect shipment. Fertilize with azalea food as the new growth begins in the spring and immediately after blooming.
