## "ATTENTION: COMPUTER OWNERS!"

This comes long before I ever had a computer, or even considered one. But this heading comes from an ad in the April 1989 AIS Bulletin, announcing the IRIS (Iris Retrieval and Information System) which had a garden location listing, so you could have a "map" of your garden in minutes! Ten years later, I still haven't reached that point. This program ran on an IBM-PC, XT, AT, or $100 \%$ compatible pe with DOS 2.0 or greater. This implies that at that time there was no Windows. There was "no need to learn any complicated programming language" as the program was user friendly. Features included Inventory, Sales, Reports and Utilities, all for $\$ 49.95$ for the Collector's Edition or $\$ 189.95$ for the Commercial Edition. All this came to you from RICHARD A. TASCO of Apache Junction, AZ who could only be our Rick Tasco, now of Cathy's Valley!
