## **ORDERING AND SHIPPING**

Shipping and handling fees are for Continental U.S. and Alaska only. Sorry no International Orders.

All orders are accepted subject to the availability of stock. Your check or money order must be sent with your order. Orders will be processed in the order received; you'll be immediately contacted, by e-mail or phone.

*Please order early for best selections*

We ship August and September. Try not to request a date when your temperatures will be above 95°F but at least a month before your first frost. We ship at the first of the week so that your order will be ready for you to plant on the weekend. Plants are shipped bare root.

Inspected and cleared each year to be disease and pest free by the Washington State Department of Agriculture, we ship healthy true to name stock. Complaints about conditions of stock must be sent to us immediately after package is received. We cannot be responsible for loss over the winter or your growing practices. Plants may not bloom the first year after transplanting; if they do it will not be typical of a two or three year old plant.

## BEARDED IRIS

Over the years I have been selecting for show quality cut blooms and plants that are more disease resistant in the Columbia River Gorge, USDA Zone 8, with an annual rain fall of 90-plus inches.

Culture: Full sun, good air circulation, moderately fertile soil, good drainage, lifting and dividing every three years will give you strong plants with show stems and bloom.

Deciduous and summer drought tolerant.

**S** – Standards, the top half of the flower

**F** – Falls, the bottom half of the flower

**B** – Beard, the fuzzy appendage on the fall

### STANDARD DWARF BEARDED (SDB)

All \$ 4.00 each

Growing into a tight mound with many blooms 8 to 16 inches tall this iris is considered by many to be the perfect rockery iris. These need a good winter chill to bloom properly. Peak bloom for us is mid to late April. Zone 3-8 (9?)

Graceful flowers on a grass-like foliage plant. These are hybrids from species native to central Europe; they are very strong, hardy and adaptable in the perennial bed. However it can also thrive in a moist garden setting such as a rain garden receiving 1-2 inches weekly. All are deciduous. Growing from 24 to 36 inches tall with 4 to 6 inch flowers. ## IRIS ENSATA

### (JAPANESE IRIS)

Iris ensata have been selectively bred from wild forms found in northern Asia, known as "Hanashobu" in Japan. Their cultural needs are very demanding, thriving in rich moist soils, if met they will reward you with a magnificent display of color approximately 2 to 3 weeks after Tall Bearded, Siberian, and Iris laevigata bloom. Peak bloom in our garden is the last two weeks of June, first week in July. Very good as a container plant for the patio, see container culture.

#### DESCRIPTION

Height, number of branches, and buds, were taken when the plants were three years old, and grown to my best ability. *Culture has a great influence; please refer to the cultural sheet.*

<b>F = FALLS</b>	Number of petals - 3F single, 6F double, 9-12F, peony form
<b>S = STANDARDS</b>	The 3 smaller petals of a 3F flower.
<b>STYLES</b>	The 3 female parts of the flower. Some flowers have multiples that can be most striking.
<b>CREST</b>	The flared end of the styles. Can be very large and showy.
<b>VEINS</b>	A color pattern when the veins are darker than the base color of the petals.
<b>RAYS</b>	A color pattern when the veins are lighter than the base color of the petals.
<b>SIGNAL</b>	The bright colored spear on all falls. Can range from saffron to bright gold.
<b>HALO</b>	The area around the Signal. Only some irises have a halo, it can be very note worthy.
